### Suspensions (5 bills):

- 1) **H.R. 135** – Twenty-First Century Water Commission Act of 2005 (*Rep. Linder – Resources*)
- 2) **H.R. 482** – Pine Springs Land Exchange Act (*Rep. Neugebauer – Resources*)
- 3) **H.R. 541** – To direct the Secretary of Agriculture to convey certain land to Lander County, Nevada, and the Secretary of the Interior to convey certain land to Eureka County, Nevada, for continued use as cemeteries (*Rep. Gibbons – Resources*)
- 4) **H.R. 18** – Southern California Groundwater Remediation Act (*Rep. Baca – Resources*)
- 5) **H.R. 794** – Colorado River Indian Reservation Boundary Correction Act (*Rep. Grijalva – Resources*)
