## FLOOR SCHEDULE AND BILL SUMMARY

Votes will be postponed until 6:30 p.m.

### Suspensions (5 bills):

- 1) **H.Res. 361** – Recognizing the 75th anniversary of the establishment of the Veterans Administration on July 21, 1930 (*Rep. Buyer – Veterans' Affairs*)
- 2) **H.Res. 326** – Calling for free and fair parliamentary elections in the Republic of Azerbaijan (*Rep. Gallegly – International Relations*)
- 3) **H.Res. 328** – Recognizing the 25th anniversary of the workers' strikes in Poland in 1980 that led to the establishment of the Solidarity Trade Union (*Rep. Gallegly – International Relations*)
- 4) **H.Con.Res. 175** – Acknowledging African descendants of the transatlantic slave trade in all of the Americas with an emphasis on descendants in Latin America and the Caribbean, recognizing the injustices suffered by these African descendants, and recommending that the United States and the international community work to improve the situation of Afro-descendant communities in Latin America and the Caribbean (*Rep. Rangel – International Relations*)
- 5) **H.Res. \_\_\_\_** – Commending the continuing improvement in relations between the United States and the Republic of India (*Rep. DeLay – International Relations*)

## TOMORROW'S OUTLOOK

The GOP Leadership has announced the following schedule: on Tuesday, the House will convene at 9:00 a.m. The House Floor will be cleared immediately thereafter, in order to prepare the House Chamber for the Indian Prime Minister's address. The House will re-convene at 10:00 a.m. in Joint Meeting with the Senate to receive Dr. Manmohan Singh, Prime Minister of India. Members are encouraged to be on the Floor by 9:45 a.m. In addition, the House is expected to begin consideration of **H.R. 2601 – Foreign Relations Authorization Act, Fiscal Years 2006 and 2007** (*Rep. Smith {NJ} – International Relations*) (*Subject to a Rule*).
